We are getting more and more requests for leave of absence during term time due to families having booked holidays. Please can we gently remind you that, unless the circumstances are genuinely exceptional, these cannot be authorised.

Currently if a child's attendance is below 90% we send a letter, which can be followed by more formal processes if attendance does not improve. If your child's attendance is below 90% they will have missed at least 20 days over the year: this is like missing a whole month of school. On your child's annual report you will be able to see how many days of school your child has missed, as well as their % attendance. Please help us keep our attendance at a minimum of 97%.
