The children have settled back brilliantly into the rhythm of the new school year. I am already seeing children being so proud of their work and challenging themselves. I am fortunate to be taking Year 3 swimming each Monday. Not only are they showing joy in the pool but they are all determined to improve their techniques. Staff from another school came over to praise the behaviour of our children, commenting on how well they listened to the swimming teachers. Well done Year 3!



Year 3 also received their Bibles at a special service led by our rector, Rev Lorna and presented by our vice chair of governors, Mr Simmons. We would like to thank St Mary's Church for a wonderful service and their kind donation. Each Bible has the child's name scribed inside. The Bibles will be heavily used through their time in Key Stage 2.

Secondary school places - September 2026


Applications are open for all year 6 children who will be starting secondary school in September 2026. Please ensure you apply before 31st October.

Magnetic Safety (Child Accident Prevention Trust)

The Child Accident Prevention Trust (CAPT) warns that more than 300 children a year are rushed to A&E after swallowing magnets and one in ten needs life-saving surgery.

When strong magnets stick together inside the body, they can rip through a child's gut, cutting off blood supply and causing life-threatening injuries. Even toddlers have needed hours of emergency surgery, and some children are left with lasting internal damage.

Magnets don't just come in toys – they're also found in jewellery kits, fridge magnets, puzzles, dartboards, fidget toys and desk gadgets. Worryingly, some magnets sold online are 17 times stronger than the UK safety limit.

Remember to:

- Buy only from trusted brands and retailers.
 Online websites like Temu, Shein etc don't test their products to EU standards so are often dangerous and poorly made.
- Be cautious with cheap copies and online marketplaces.
- Keep magnets and products containing them out of children's reach.

The same also applies with the small button batteries.


