As the term progresses, there's a sense of purpose and progress across the school. Academically, we're all working hard and enjoying lessons. Year 4 are focusing very well on their multiplication tables ahead of the formal DfE check later this year. One of the best ways you can support your child is by helping them learn their times tables by rote, along with related division facts—it's never too early to get started!

Talking of which, your child is never too old to be read to. Next week is National Story Telling Week. Teachers are planning activities and our Reading Ambassadors will be reading aloud to their classes. Some are planning to read poems, jokes, short stories or even recipes!

So please do read to your child or tell them an imaginative story or even perhaps an event from your childhood because the 1 Million Word Gap is a real issue we all need to be aware of and its consequences in learning and life chances.



Have you heard of the 1 Million Word Gap? Key Findings

The Gap: A study using popular children's books found that children who have five books read to them daily hear approximately 1.4 million more words by age five than children who are never read to.

Frequency Matters:

- Never read to: children know 4,600 words by age 5.
- Read daily: children know 297,000 words by age 5.
- Read 5 books/day: children know 1.48 million words by age 5.

Long-Term Impact: This early language exposure builds a strong base for later reading comprehension, cognitive skills, and overall academic achievement.

Winter playtimes

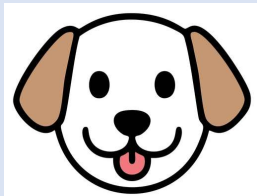


What a damp miserable month this has been. We like to get the children outside as much as we can otherwise it's a long day for them being cooped up and not being able to let off steam.

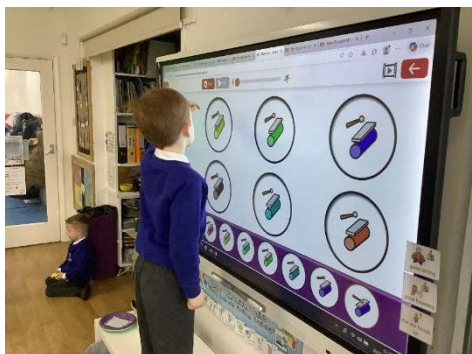
Course map - 2 laps

27th Jan - Bannerman had fun in their music lesson listening to instruments that made the sound of the sea. They learnt the words and movements to 'Down there under the sea'.



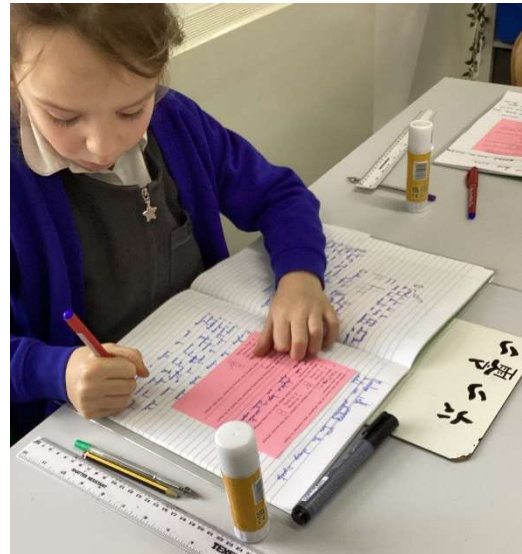
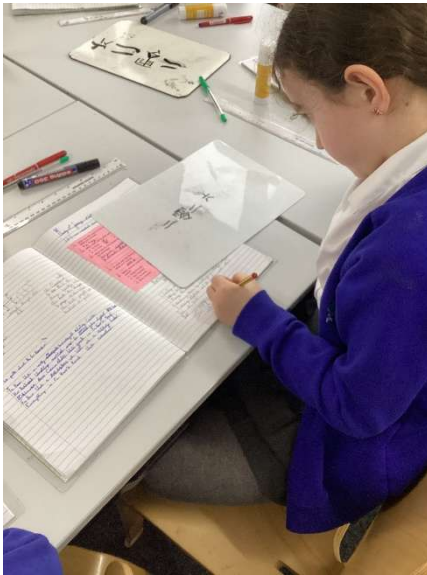
21st Jan - The children were really engaged during our reading fluency group. They practised their decoding, prosody and comprehension skills.

- All baked goods will be sold to help raise money for the school.

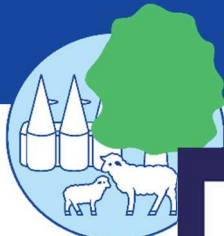
