Literacy

This term we will be reading the books 'Supertato,' 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk.'

Comprehension:

- I can identify what the main events in a story
- I can make predictions about what might happen next in a story
- I can re-tell a story in my own words
- I can use new vocabulary learnt from a text

Word Reading:

- I know all of the Phase 2 and 3 tricky words taught so far
- I can read words containing two or more digraphs, longer words, compound words and words ending in -ing, -s and -es
- I can read a simple sentence that is based on my Phonics knowledge

Writing:

- I can form most letters of the alphabet correctly
- I can spell words using the Phonics knowledge I have
- I can write a short caption independently
- I can write a short sentence with some support

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Self-Regulation:

- I can set and work towards an end goal
- I am beginning to show an understanding of other's feelings
- I can focus for longer periods of time during whole class inputs

Managing Self:

- I know the importance of a healthy diet
- I can talk about where my food comes from
- I am developing my confidence, independence and perseverance when faced with a challenge

- How do Christians celebrate Easter Sunday?

Physical Development

Our PE topic this term is Ball Skills

Gross motor:

- I can roll a ball and stop a rolling one
- I can throw and kick a ball to a target
- I can bounce, throw and catch a ball
- I can dribble a ball with my feet and hands

Fine motor:

- I can use an effective pencil grip to form letters accurately
- I can use one handed tools such as scissors, paintbrushes, chalks, glue sticks effectively and safely
- I can begin to show accuracy when drawing

Mathematics

Number:

- I can explore and make my own representations of 9 and 10
- I can use conceptual subitising to recognise groups in numbers to 10
- I can explore the composition of numbers to 10
- I can explore number bonds to 10 using objects
- I can build 10 using two parts
- I can explore the different ways 10 can be arranged

Numerical Patterns:

- I can make comparisons with the numbers and amounts to 10
- I can identify 1 more and 1 less using numbers to 10
- I can find and make doubles to 10
- I can identify an odd or even number up to 10

Shape

- I can recognise and name 3D shapes
- I can find 2D shapes within 25 shapes
- I can find 3D shapes in the environment
- I can copy and continue a pattern

Understanding the World (UW)

Past and Present:

• I can explain how my family celebrates Easter.

People. Culture and Communities:

 I can explain how Christians celebrate Easter in England and how this might be different in other parts of the world.

The Natural World:

- I can identify, observe and draw pictures to show signs of Spring

- I can make observations and drawings of plants and minibeasts
