#### Uniform

We still have 2 terms to go before the summer. Please can I remind you that uniform is an important part of being a pupil at Hunton, giving pupils a sense of belonging, fairness and respect. We have a uniform policy that is agreed by our children, school council and school governors and we have high expectations that our children come to school looking smart. We also believe that school uniform promotes inclusivity. If a child dresses differently then others do notice that difference and this gives the opportunity for comment. We believe school is not somewhere where children should feel anxious about how they dress - our school uniform code prevents this. There are regular reminders in the newsletter and details of our uniform on the school website for parents. In school children are reminded collectively in assembly that we are proud to belong to Hunton and that uniform makes things fair for everyone. Children are also reminded by all staff if they are not wearing uniform. Occasionally there may be a very good reason why a child is not wearing a specific item and the parents have made us aware of this which we fully understand.

Uniform puts all children on a level playing field so children can concentrate on the things that matter at school – being happy and making the most of their education.
