Hunton CEP School PTFA Chair Report – AGM Fri 21st Nov 2025

Welcome everyone, and thanks so much for coming along to today's AGM.

At Hunton, the PTFA's main purpose is simple: we want to help make school life even better for our children. As a small rural school, every bit of support goes a long way, and we're really lucky to have such a supportive community of parents, carers, teachers and friends who get stuck in and make things happen.

The PTFA committee is elected each year at the AGM, which—despite being our only formal meeting—helps keep everything running smoothly for the year ahead. Alongside myself as Chair and Kathy Reid as Treasurer, we have Rachel Kelly who came on board last year as Secretary.

Before Kathy takes you through the numbers, I wanted to give a quick roundup of last year.

Fundraising Highlights

Our biggest fundraising events, as always, were the May Fayre and Christmas Fayre, which together made up over half of our annual income. These take a huge amount of planning and volunteer time, and they're consistently the most popular and best-supported events we run. Thank you to everyone who helped, donated, baked, lifted, carried and smiled their way through the chaos—your effort genuinely makes a massive difference!

We also brought back the much-loved Curry & Quiz Night after a year off, and it was brilliant to see such a great turnout. It's always a fantastic evening and a real community favourite.

Another lovely addition last year was our Wreath Making Workshop, which was new to the PTFA calendar and went down really well. Huge thanks to Rachel and her sister for running this as well as the popular Photo Garland opportunity.

Alongside these, we ran all the usual favourites—including the Disco (which this year the kids loved even more due to their K Pop Demon Hunter obsession), Cake and Sweet sales, Easter Egg hunts and lots of other smaller fundraisers — which all add up across the year.

What Your Support Helped Us Fund

Because of the money raised last year, the PTFA was able to pay for:
