#### **Headteacher News**

Welcome back to school and the first newsletter of the year. I hope you all had a great summer break. It's hard to believe that only 4 days have passed since the children returned to school as everyone has settled in so well. A warm welcome goes to our youngest learners in Devas, our newcomers and the families who are new to Hunton. We are genuinely excited about collaborating with every one of you and brimming with enthusiasm as we embark on what promises to be an enriching first term. We would also formally like to welcome Mrs Russell, our new teacher in Bannerman though it already feels she has been at Hunton for some time as she has fitted into our team so well.



On Wednesday morning, I had to share some sad news with the children. Mrs Devas who has always passionately supported our school passed away. For many years Mrs Devas has come in to school with Daisy, her reading dog, to hear the children read. The children loved reading to her and Daisy. Likewise, she showed interest in all the staff, making each one of us feel that we were doing a special job, making a difference for all the children. Not only has she been a chair of governors at the school but most notably and generously with Mr Devas donated part of their land for a new school to be built in 1963. This was when she lived at Hunton Court. We have such fond memories of her kindness, generosity and loyalty. The children have loved playing, reading and singing to her in her beautiful garden. How wonderful it has been to have had such an exceptional lady support us over the many years.

Mrs Devas always read our newsletters and I know she would have been interested in the visit we had today from Katie Lam, MP. It is quite unusual for an MP to visit a school, especially a small, rural one so we had our questions ready for her. Such as 'Why can't the play equipment be repaired at Hunton Park?' 'Can SMART phones be banned for children?' 'Can we all have free milk?' 'Why do we have to be tested on nonsense words in the Y1 phonics test?' 'Why, as a rural school, do we have to pay more for swimming lessons because of the cost of a coach when Maidstone children do not?' We are really hoping to visit the Houses of Parliament to learn more about democracy and how our voice can be heard.


#### **Changing Weather**
