Another Friday, another reason to celebrate our fantastic, supportive community here at Hunton CE Primary after our SIAMS inspection. SIAMS inspections focus on the impact of Church schools' Christian visions on pupils and adults.

Although we wait for the final report and judgement to be made and shared with you, we want to say a massive THANK YOU! A week ago, we were busily preparing the final timetable for our SIAMS inspection. The ten-hour inspection included meetings with parents, children, staff and governors as well as sessions with Mr Ming and myself.

I really appreciated the parents who gave their time and came in to meet the inspectors. I also know that the staff were incredibly grateful to the parent who provided cakes and cookies to get us through the day. Thank you!

Here's to the incredible pupils of Hunton: your positive behaviour and achievements make us proud every day. The children were more than brilliant, articulating how our vision of 'life in all its fullness', John 10:10 and the story of Peter (Matthew 14) showing trust in Jesus when he stepped out of his comfort zone to walk on water actually affects their lives. Enthusiastically they relayed times when they not only challenged themselves academically but also personally. Tales of rock climbing, football, swimming achievements, showing sheep and learning to ride a bike were just a few. They also shared our values too, especially describing compassion here at Hunton and how we all help and listen to one another. Towards the end of a long day, when there had been so much to celebrate and share with the inspectors, two children excitedly told us that we had nothing to worry about as they had told the inspector that Hunton is 'brilliant' and 'outstanding'. Words are hard to find but I am so proud of our children and staff.
